In Memory of Dr. Charlie Jean Salter

Dr. Charlie Jean Shepherd Salter was born and raised in Orlando, Florida on July 2, 1928. After graduating Jones High School in 1946 she attended Alabama State University in historic Montgomery Alabama where she received her B.S. degree in Biology in 1950. While at ASU she played basketball and joined the varsity team in her freshman year and later became captain of the squad in her junior and senior year. She married her husband after graduation and she taught in Escambia County Training School (Atmore, Alabama) for 4 years. After returning to Florida she spent 15 years in Orange County Florida Public Schools system where she taught at: Charles R. Drew High School Winter Garden, FL and Memorial Junior High School Orlando, FL. During this time she attended Florida A & M University, Tallahassee, Florida where she received her graduate degree in education in 1961. In 1967 she received her Masters of Science degree in Biology from Southern University, Baton Rouge, Louisiana. Dr. Charlie Jean Salter later began the pursuit of her doctorate degree. She received her Ed.D in Education from Nova University Fort Lauderdale, Florida in 1979.

The remainder of her professional life (20 years) was spent while teaching at Valencia College, she conducted research there which resulted in her developing an innovative program in the Biology department that was being used at the college. She authored the Biology Laboratory Manual which was published by the Hunter Publishing Company, Winston-Salem N.C. After retirement in 1992, Dr. Salter fully devoted her time to her community by being a servant leader and business owner of several rental properties. She worked diligently in the efforts to increase voter registration and participation within her community. She approached all challenges in earnest pursuit. She boldly tackled problems and she did it effortlessly. She loved her fellow neighbors and for the city at large. Dr. Salter felt that a great community depends upon its people.

Dr. Salter was a proud member of the Epsilon Epsilon Zeta Chapter of Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Inc.



This scholarship is available for two **minority females**, graduating from Jones High School. "Minority" is defined as a member of a **traditionally underrepresented community** (i.e.: African-American, Hispanic/Latino, Asian, Pacific-Islander, etc.). This recurring scholarship will be awarded for the **Fall Semester** of the upcoming academic year. The scholarship award will be \$1250 for each recipient. The scholarship will be made payable directly to the college or university, to be applied toward tuition or other college expenses. All recipients will be notified by **May 1st, 2023** via email, mail or phone.

- 2. Applicants must supply proof of acceptance and matriculation to a college or university such as a letter of acceptance. A candidate for the scholarship may submit their application prior to receiving acceptance into a college or university (provided they have completed all other parts of the application). However, a candidate's application will not be considered complete until proof of matriculation is received by the scholarship committee, prior to the deadline.
- 3. Applicants must be full-time students in good standing with an **academic weighted GPA of 3.0 or higher**.
- 4. Applicants must be pursuing a degree in Education or Science.
- 5. A **professional** or **senior photograph** should be included with the application. No selfies or cell phone pictures will be accepted. However, proofs from senior photos will be accepted.
- 6. Official High School transcripts and two letters of recommendation must accompany the application. One must come from a current teacher and the other recommendation must come from an organizational leader, an employer, or a spiritual leader. Letters must be on <u>official letterhead, signed in ink by the recommender, and in sealed envelopes</u>. Transcripts must be <u>sealed</u>.

Applications will not be considered if not postmarked by the specified date, are incomplete, and/or are not signed by the student. All requirements must be met for consideration.
